PRESENTATION HIGHLIGHTS:

Learn the key points that should be included in your Water Shortage Contingency Plan (WSCP), and use this class to create or update your WSCP. Get a free manual with templates for forms that all water systems need to implement a WSCP. Find out how to prepare your system now for potential future water shortages. As recent years have shown, California is extremely prone to drought so it is as important as ever to prepare for water shortages in diverse situations. Is your system drought prepared? Do you know your drought status? If you are an urban water system serving a population of 3,000 or more than 3,000 acre feet, your system is required, by the state, to have a completed WSCP. However, WSCPs are highly recommended for all water systems. This class will also cover energy use, and how to use less and save more. After class there will be two hours to assist individuals with resources and support. If you already have a WSCP, please bring it to the class with you.
